Pile Driving Continues June 12 and 13 at I-66 and Dulles Connector Road

Metro Service between East and West Falls Church Stations to be Disrupted Again

The Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project will continue pile driving activities near the future connection point for the Dulles Rail extension and Metro's existing Orange Line at I-66 and the Dulles Connector Road (Route 267) on Saturday and Sunday, June 12 and 13.

Rail construction crews will again drive steel piles into soil to support foundations for future spans that carry the aerial portion of the tracks for the new rail line into the median of the Dulles Connector Road.

Pile driving will begin on Saturday, June 12, and will continue Sunday, June 13. Pile driving work will begin at 7 a.m. each morning and will continue until 9 p.m. each evening. Residents of the area can expect to hear significant noise. Pile driving usually is done in intervals of about 15 minutes with a similar break in between activities.

This is the third and last consecutive weekend of currently planned rail project construction in this area that requires disruption of Metrorail services at the East Falls Church and West Falls Church Metro station. Both stations will remain open.

Again this weekend, Metro will provide free shuttle buses to carry passengers to and from these two stations along the Orange Line. Riders should allow an additional 30 minutes for their trips. Last weekend, 26,517 people used the shuttles.

In addition to the daily pile driving, Dulles Metrorail crews will be performing a variety of other construction activities at this site 24 hours a day.

Metro said regular service on the Orange Line between the East Falls Church and West Falls Church Metrorail stations will resume when the Metrorail system opens on Monday morning, June 14.
