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Bridge Construction to Close Spring Hill Road at Route 7 Overnights on or about Dec. 13; Detours Scheduled

Drivers using north and southbound Spring Hill Road at Route 7 in Tysons will experience detours overnights starting on or about Tuesday, Dec. 13, because of Dulles Corridor Metrorail Project Construction.

Thru traffic on Spring Hill Road will not be permitted to cross Route 7 because of aerial bridge construction involving a large horizontal crane, also known as truss. The closing of the intersection will take place between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. Any changes in times will be announced tomorrow.

Thru traffic on eastbound and westbound Route 7 will not be affected. Turns from eastbound Route 7 on to northbound Spring Hill Road will not be permitted. Turns from westbound Route 7 to southbound Spring Hill Road will not be allowed.

Here is how the detours will work:

- Southbound Spring Hill Road thru traffic **and** motorists wanting to turn left on to eastbound Leesburg Pike will need to turn right on to westbound Leesburg Pike, then U-turn at Tyco Road/Westwood Center Drive, and continue on eastbound Leesburg Pike toward Spring Hill Road.
- Northbound Spring Hill Road thru traffic **and** motorists wanting to turn left on to westbound Leesburg Pike will need to turn right on to eastbound Leesburg Pike, U-turn at Westpark Drive/Gosnell Road, and continue on westbound Route 7 to access Spring Hill Road.

In addition, a few nights over the next month when bridge crews will close **both** the Spring Hill Road and Westpark Drive/Gosnell Road intersections. Those dates and appropriate detours will be announced when these closures are scheduled.



Drivers should expect approximately 10- to 15-minute travel delays if traveling through this area during these closures, which are expected to last through the end of the year.

After crossing the Spring Hill/Route 7 intersection, the crane/truss will continue to move west toward the Dulles Toll Road (Route 267). The truss will cross the intersection of Tyco Road/Westwood Center Drive, expected in early 2012.

Police will be onsite during all closures. Motorists are urged to use extreme caution, and pay attention to signage. All work is weather-dependent and subject to change.
